
5. Student Support and Progression

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The syllabus is provided by the Sarguja University, Ambikapur. From our college about 16 faculty members are the chairpersons and members of the Board of Studies in various subjects for Curriculum Development.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

New technology is introduced so that the students become aware of the latest knowledge by using it and they become more practical in their lives.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Monthly tests are taken after completion of each unit. After completion of syllabus a model examination is given. So that student can prepare for their annual exam. Annual examination and Evaluation is conducted by University. Many faculty members are the paper setter and evaluator of University annual examination.

6.3.4 Research and Development

PG students are always guided by the faculty, for research work and project works are done in Psychology department. Students are supervised for their dissertation work and Ph.D. thesis. Research work is going on in Microbiology, Psychology, Economics and Commerce department.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

There are 26,915 text books, 874 reference books, 674 journals of various subjects and 22 CDs are available in Library. For automation of library, we purchased a software LibSyhs, the process of automation of library is going on. There are 5 computers with internet facilities available for the students.

A well established library with 120 seating capacity of students is open Six days for students. About 400 students user browse books from the library.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Enough human resource is available for smooth functioning of the college. It includes 61 teaching, 37 non teaching, 1620 students and the management of the college. For curricular activities we have faculty members and supporting staff such as Lab technicians, Lab attendant etc, and for co-curricular and extra-curricular activities various cells, association, committees and student union manages the fruitful performance of the college.

Faculty member and staff are recruited as per UGC rule 2009 and Higher education of Chhattisgarh state.



Two Best Practices of the College:

1. Extension programme :

Extension programme under N.S.S. is one of the best practices in Holy Cross Women's College. These N.S.S. Students get Orientation lectures preparing theme for the service of the nation in various ways. The students go to the adopted village and conduct programmes for the villagers. Besides these, we conduct a seven day Camp in the adopted village. About 50 students along with N.C.C. programme officers and other staff stay seven days in the village. They do cleaning of the village, road making, help poor villagers to harvest their paddy, visit their homes, make health survey etc. They find out what are the common sicknesses in the village. They are malaria, ordinary fever, T.B. typhoid, diarrhoea dysentery, cough etc. The students collect medicines from Holy Cross Hospital, arrange for a doctor and nurse where people get medical help. Then they are exhorted to contact hospitals for treatment.

In the evening the N.S.S. students, play the drum and hearing the drum sound, the villagers come to the camp site. The students put up Nukad Drama to teach them lessons and give them awareness about the dangers of superstition child marriage, illiteracy and cutting down trees. They are given awareness of sanitation, Literacy, health practice, discipline, environmental issues, importance of growing trees etc. After seven days the camp is concluded, the students leave the village, the neighbouring villages also come to see them off because the neighbouring Villagers also attend their programme.

By this programme of the N.S.S., the villagers are awakened. They send their children to school, control bad habits and practices, learn to live peacefully and enjoy living their life.

2. Flower gardens :

Our gardeners are directed to plant seasonal flowers plants throughout the year. The N.S.S. students as part of their environmental programme, join activities of cleaning, pruning and weeding out the grass. In front of the cottage which reminds of English. Cottages, we have a very colourful garden. One would see the joy in the face of the gardener, joy that resembles the beauty of the flowers he has brought up. Our students, parents and visitors watch and enjoy the colourful garden. We have a large garden in the middle of the college portion, from any block one can enjoy the view of the flowers that are smiling at all who gaze at them. They are dalia, Gladiola, Asther,

bleeding heart, marigold, Roses, lilies, daisy, zenia, orchid, holihook, balsom etc. – most of them are seasonal, they visit us and after two weeks, a month, a month and a half they disappear to visit us in the following year. The planting, pruning mannuring, watering, sight seeing are all the activities that go on in our college garden.

As a result the students develop aesthetic sense, they learn to keep their surrounding beautiful and clean. It is a very good practice maintaining these flower gardens in the campus.
