College has the proud records of being one among the top Ten College’s in India and the only College in MP & Chhattisgarh which underwent accreditation by NAAC for the first time in 1998 and to receive 5-star grade which was the highest at that time. At present college went through the 4th cycle of NAAC accreditation and awarded with “A” grade (3.16) by National Assessment and Accreditation Council.

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Total 1667 students were enrolled in the college, 1467 in UG programmes, category wise they are SC:30, ST:538, OBC:481 and Gen:418) and 200 in PG programme and category wise SC:3, ST:89, OBC:52 and Gen:56.

Action plan for the upcoming session of the college


- ❖ To start 4 years integrated courses B.Sc. B. Ed and B.A. B.Ed.
